

What is a Career? – Sweetpotato Ag Mag Edition

Mini-Lesson Focus:

What's a career?

A career is an occupation undertaken for a significant period of a person's life and with opportunities for progress and growth, most people describe a career as a job or their work.

- 1. Discussion: What types of careers do you think of the most?
- Say to students, "I wonder if you think about what you will be when you grow up." Allow students time to jot thoughts and ideas about careers, maybe even a career they want for themselves one day, draw pictures, write words, phrases, etc.
- Say to students, "Taking time to look to the future is important and understanding how we get there is the most important part."
- Say to students, "Today we are going to look at careers related to a vegetable that we often eat."
- Hold up a sweetpotato.
- Say to students, "What if I told you this sweetpotato needed people in many different careers for it to be brought to consumers like you and me."
- Say to students, "Today we are going to look into a few careers that will help us better understand how sweetpotatoes are grown and make it to our plate."
- 2. With your students, turn to the career portion of the Sweetpotato Ag Mag.
- Students will read about three career pathways related to growing sweetpotatoes.
 - Sweetpotato Farmer
 - Entomologist
 - Commercial Horticulture Extension Agent
- After the mini-lesson, students should expand their learning to focus on core content standards aligned to curriculum.

- Use digital media offered through <u>sweetpotato career videos</u> to learn about other careers related to sweetpotatoes.
- Say to students, "What other careers might be needed to get sweetpotatoes to the consumer?" Students should share things directly from the videos: registered dietician, food entrepreneur, chef & restaurant owner, agricultural engineer, school nutrition director, farmer
- Say to students, "What career pathway interests you the most?" Students will take time to research and answer questions about different career pathways.
